Deforestation in Colombia



Background

Deforestation is an ongoing issue in many conflict-affected countries.

The civil war in Colombia lasted sixty years and in spite of a peace agreement being signed in 2016, there remains high rates of deforestation. The Amazon rainforest extends into Colombia and the country has a rich natural heritage.

Colombia is ranked as one of the most biodiverse countries in the world - with more 51,000 species of plants and animals – but there are ongoing threats which are driving deforestation.
